# Employee Holiday Gift Fund (Judy Francis)

With the consent of the Resident Council Executive Committee and Angela Hansen, CFO of RVI, the Employee Holiday Gift Fund has been renamed the **Employee Appreciation Gift Fund**. The first residents of Rose Villa created the Employee Appreciation Fund in 1962 as a way to say thank you to the staff; 62 years later, we are still continuing that tradition. As of March 31, the amount in the Fund was \$12,715, a bit below last year at this time. That will change after the official campaign begins in May or June with a presentation at the Resident Forum.

# Foundation Written Report (Cathy Schar)

Over 100 residents came to the Foundation's 2023 Annual Report to the Community on March 20 to hear the presentation on outcomes in 2023 by Board members and staff. Residents learned about donated income (returned to pre-pandemic levels), expenditures on Resident Assistance and the other three Pillars (services) in 2023, plus the outcomes and successes in 2023. A sumptuous Happy Hour preceded the meeting.

The 2023 published Annual Report was provided, as well as the introduction of a brand-new video about the Rose Villa Foundation. # Food Think Tank Report (Anna Van Tyne)

Norine and Marty reviewed the Harvest Grill menu changes, effective March 5, 2024. A summer cookout to recognize Gay Pride, the Stonewall anniversary, and to celebrate Fourth of July is proposed for June 26, 2024.

The mug project has evolved into education and encouragement to use fewer throw-away cups. Drink cards will be offered to encourage the use of washable drink containers.

### Ready Force (Jean Lofy)

Ready Force has just completed its first CERT-Lite Training program for 12 residents. CERT stands for Community Emergency Response Team. "Lite" refers to customizing the national FEMA-based training for Rose Villa. This was a five-week, 20-hour course that met twice a week. Volunteers were trained in disaster preparedness -- many thanks to Steve Morris, a certified CERT Trainer.

#### Safety Committee (Mayo Marsh)

The Safety Committee has been working on the issue of the visibility of signage at the entrances to Rose Villa. Other issues they are working on include 1) the need to repaint the reflective paint on the exterior stairs annually, 2) the need for another marked crosswalk on Wild Rose Drive between the Northeast and North Pocket trash areas, 3) the parking blocks anti-trip sticks need to be checked annually for potential replacement on Main Street parking, 4) the Main Street pillar will have the electrical put underground. The Safety Committee meets on the second Wednesday of the month, but they are not planning to meet in May.

#### Sewing & Quilting (Mary Claire Phelan)

Due to overlapping events during the sewing and quilting scheduled time on Friday, we are trying the second and fourth Mondays from 2:00-4:00 PM. We think you would enjoy coming.
