Sunday Suppers (Susan Hyne)

The Year-to-date totals through the end of the month (including potlucks): 17 meals with 361 diners. Three Sunday Suppers and a potluck were held in May and 81 meals were served. The June schedule features four meals, plus a potluck hosted by the Resident Council North District. Sunday Suppers were promoted at a May 1st gathering of future neighbors to meet our new CEO.
