

Mr. Adams moved that the division of the funds be made by the president, vice president and the secretary. Motion seconded and carried. A suggestion was made that a full account of the collection and disbursement of funds be placed in the January issue of the Rose Villa News.

There was no further business to be transacted and adjournment was in order.
