Q1: RV arranges for flu shots through CVS Pharmacy for residents who have insurance other than Kaiser Permanente and RV employees have KP as their health care provider. I understand that RV nurses gave the flu shots to Employees. Is there some reason that residents with KP insurance were not included in this flu shot option also given by RV nurses? It would have been nice to have not had to pay for transportation to take me to the KP drive through at Clackamas Town Center. I am not the only resident with KP insurance and having RV nurses give us the shots would benefit us all.

A1: Rose Villa pays for flu vaccines for employees. We do not run those through insurance. We just pay the cost. This is the route that we believe gets us to the highest vaccination rate for staff, which is the best thing we can do to protect both staff health and resident health. For residents, we partner with a pharmacy that will come onsite and that will bill resident insurance. That pharmacy is CVS and they do not accept Kaiser insurance.

Q2: It appears that some residents are having their air filters replaced since the wildfire smoke. Will this be true of all apartments? Is there a schedule? Has it been published? If not, does each resident have to put in a work order? More information, please.

A2: No work order required. We began replacing all resident air filters in late September and finished last week. Our Building Operations Technicians went through neighborhood by neighborhood. All resident filters have been replaced or washed and reinstalled depending on the filter type. More information can be found in the September 23, 2020, letter from John Schallberger.
