COVID-19

Please tune in to our weekly COVID-19 Infectious Disease Taskforce livestream (or pick up the accompanying notes) to stay informed about any changes to campus policy and infectious status.

From our recent breakthrough cases, I'd like to emphasize and ask that no one take ANY sign of illness for granted. At this point, it helps us all if you treat it as possible COVID and limit your contacts, call our hot line, and get a test if you

have symptoms. Be aware of how you feel and what is going on around you, both here at Rose Villa and wherever else you go. The hotline is always available at ext. 1234, so don't hesitate to call, even if you think you probably do not have COVID.

Similarly, if you have contact with someone else who has, or suspects they have COVID, do not gather with other people! Be conservative and quarantine for 3-5 days, monitoring for symptoms. Follow up with the suspected person to find out their test results so you know what next steps to take.

Recycling Projects: The Green Team has additional information on Rose Villa's continuing and very successful recycling of #1 clear (as in, non-color) plastics. Those are the ones with the number 1 in the triangle, that may also have the letters P...E...T or P...E...T...E. Just remember...it's our "PET" recycling project...or for "PETE's" sake.

This recycling has its very own specially-marked green bin. Currently, there's just one located in the service entry area on the South side of South Main. Soon, we will have a special green bin located in North Pocket, The Oaks, and Garden Grove neighborhoods.

In just 10 days of recycling #1 plastics last month, we collected eight bin loads. Our thanks to Jack Duren for filling his trusty pickup to the max and driving to our recycler. We're ready to go again!

Q&A

- Q. Why was the decision made not to install solar panels on Schroeder Lofts and the new Madrona Grove? Why did solar energy pencil out for the Oaks and not for the new construction?
- A. We have evaluated solar for every single building we have constructed since 2014 all of the phases. It is a combination of what power we need, the storage capacity for it, as well as the cost of panels, subsidies available, etc. The Oaks neighborhood was designed as a "net zero" neighborhood, as is Trillium Townhomes. This pencils out mostly because the entrance fees are at the level needed to offset the extra construction cost. The goal of Phase 3 was to build Madrona Grove, so our financial resources were deployed to make sure that happened.

Adding solar panels to Schroeder Lofts or Madrona Grove would allow us to deploy net metering with PGE and get some credit for the energy generated that gets put back on the grid, but the amount of years it would take to repay the initial investment makes this not feasible

Additionally, and most relevant to the decision, adding PV does not help us with resiliency unless we also add a battery storage system and switchgear, which

we hope to do at some point. What we learned with GreenHammer recently is to add a battery "backup" to just the six Trillium homes would cost \$14,000 AND it would only last about 24 hours and only run refrigerators (not HVAC). Right now, the battery technology isn't sufficient to meet any material resiliency needs while also being cost prohibitive.

- Q. Can you provide a firm update on plans to replace fossil fuel powered lawn mowers and leaf blowers?
- A. Our current mowing service provider will be transitioning to battery powered blowers and weed eaters by no later than their first service visit in October and have already transitioned to using only mowers that comply to California emission standards.
